Evening Update

The Montana County Assist Team is continuing to assess property and infrastructure damage throughout the county, including some drone missions for properties not easily accessible. This is important for the Federal Disaster Declaration, approved today, which will supplement Montana state, tribal, local and recovery in affected areas.

Residents in Park and Stillwater counties may see drone activity in their counties on Friday.

County and state road crews continue to improve roads and bridges across the area.

We have been overwhelmed by generous donations from our community and we thank each and every person who has provided assistance.

Additional physical donations including water, food, and clothing are not needed at this time.

Roads and Bridges Status

The road from Cooke City/Silver Gate to Cody, WY is currently open.

In the Paradise Valley, Carters Bridge reopened on Wednesday.

REMINDER: All open roads between Livingston and Gardiner are for local and essential traffic only.

Continued Road Closures

Hwy 89 N from Interstate 90 to Convict Grade Road

Hwy 89 S from Emigrant to Point of Rocks

9th St. Island in Livingston

Please avoid the trails through Sacajawea Park in Livingston and the Myers River Trail due to some undercut banks.

Water Update

A “Boil Water Advisory” is in place in Gardiner and Silver Gate. It has been lifted in Cooke City by the Montana Department of Environmental Quality. For residents under the boil advisory, a rolling boil for one minute is recommended before consuming. Retail food establishments in Gardiner and Silver Gate will serve prepackaged food and drink only. No open food or open drinks may be served due to risk of water contamination.

If you are on a private well and have questions about water safety or testing please call the Park County Health Department 406-222-4145.

Flood related refuse

There will be extra green boxes placed at Chico, Gardiner, Cooke City, and temporarily at Point of Rocks (at the intersection of Hwy 89 South and Old Yellowstone Trail). Look for green boxes dedicated to flood related waste. If the boxes are full, DO NOT place debris on the ground – please come back another time to dispose of your trash. For Livingston residents, the transfer station will be open regular hours, including Saturday morning 8:15 AM to 12:15 PM. Please be advised that it may close earlier if the station reaches capacity.

Until further notice, these locations are only accepting material from inside residential or commercial structures, such as drywall, furniture, and carpeting, for example. NOT accepted at this time is river debris, such as logs, green waste, rocks and mud. Please keep that on your property until further notice. We are also not accepting large appliances, such as refrigerators and stoves, at this time.
